



The 2025 BUGATTI OWNERS' CLUB RALLY CAR SPEED CHAMPIONSHIP

1. SPORTING REGULATIONS - GENERAL

1.1. Title & Jurisdiction:

The Bugatti Owners' Club Rally Speed Championship is organised and administered by the Bugatti Owners' Club in accordance with the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.

1.3 Competitor Eligibility.

- 1.3.1 Drivers and Entrant/Drivers must be fully paid-up valid membership card holding members of the Bugatti Owners' Club Ltd., be registered for the Championship and be in possession of a valid RS Interclub as minimum Competition Licence.
- 1.3.2 Competitors shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the Championship requires absence from school, Drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from his/her school in order to fulfil registration for the Championship.
- 1.3.3 All necessary documentation must be available for checking at all rounds when signing-on.
- 1.3.4 All necessary documentation must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing-on.

1.4 Registration.

- 1.4.2 The registration fee for the Championship is £45.00
- 1.4.3 Competitors must register at least 14 days before the first event in which they intend to compete. Entry into the Championship commences from the date of registration and points will not be awarded retrospectively. Driver & vehicle details, including existing & new modifications, must be declared at the time of registration to allow accurate handicapping to take place. Failure to comply with this will result in deleted scores. In the event of a vehicle breakdown, competitors may switch to another vehicle within the class they are registered. Points will only be scored if a suitable handicap has been applied to the new vehicle by the series handicapper prior to the scoring runs.

1.4.4 Whilst every effort will be made to circulate event supplementary regulations, the onus is on the entrant to obtain them.

1.4.5 Drivers must compete in a minimum of five dedicated rounds to qualify for an end of season award.

1.4.6 To be eligible for scoring in the series all competing cars must carry Championship decals as laid down in the advertising rules issued by Motorsport UK under Ch.6 App.1 Art 9.2 and Ch.6 App.1 Art 9.3. – Failure to comply will lead to deleted scores

1.5 The following events form the Qualifying Rounds of the 2025 Championship:

Saturday 7th June 2025 - Prescott

Saturday 28th June 2025 - Prescott

Sunday 3rd August 2025 – Harewood

Saturday 23rd August 2025 - Gurston Down

Sunday 14th September 2025 - Curborough Sprint

Saturday 4th October 2025 - Prescott

Saturday 1st November 2025 - Prescott

1.6 Championship Scoring for the Series;

1.6.1 The Championship will be based on handicap scoring and points are based on the results of all that have entered into a championship round.

The points system is as follows:

1st = 20 points

2nd = 18 points

3rd = 16 points

4th = 14 points

5th = 13 points

6th = 12 points

7th = 11 points

8th = 10 points

9th = 9 points

10th = 8 points

11th = 7 points

12th = 6 points

13th = 5 points

The rest = 4 points

1.6.2 The Class Championship will be based on handicap scoring and points scored are based on results from the events entered purely on the order of finish of cars within their respective class. There will be a class championship for each respective class within the championship. All points listed below include two for scrutineering and signing on, one for completing a practice run, and one for a completing competitive timed run. Only 1 point will be given for practice and competitive runs regardless of how many are completed.

1.6.2 Should two or more drivers at the same event tie on their positions they will be allocated the same points for that round. The points for the following places which would have been allocated if there had not been a tie will be left unallocated and following this the standard points will be allocated as detailed below.

- three for a first, two for a second and one for a third, from all chosen qualifying events, subject to a minimum of four starters in the respective class. In the event of a tie the most first places, second places etc. decides.

1.6.3 Any appeals against points must be lodged in accordance with the Motorsport UK Year Book procedure.

1.6.4 Anybody beating their handicap by more than 5% will score a maximum of 4 points.

1.6.5 Points will be published regularly by the Bugatti Owners' Club

1.7 Awards.

The overall winner and winners of other named awards will not be eligible for any other awards.

1.7.1 The season will conclude with the Rally Speed Championship Trophy going to the overall winner with the most points scored. In the event of a tie the overall winner will be decided on the most first places, then the most second places etc. The overall winner will not be eligible for any other award.

1.7.2 There will be an award for first in each class providing a minimum of three successful points scoring entries. In the event of a tie the class places will be decided on the most first places, then the second places etc.

2. SPORTING REGULATIONS - Judicial Procedures.

2.1 **Rounds:** In accordance with Chapter 2 of the 2025 Motorsport UK NCR's and the Bugatti Owners' Club Rally Speed Championship.

2.2 **Championship:** In accordance with Chapter 2 of the 2025 Motorsport UK NCR's and the Bugatti Owners' Club Rally Speed Championship.

3. TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

3.1 The Bugatti Owners' Club Rally Speed Championship is open to competitors participating in....

3.2 To be eligible for the Championship all vehicles must comply with the Common Regulations and Specific Regulations for Modified Cars and Sports Libre Cars in Chapter 14 of the 2025 Motorsport UK NCR's, Specific Regulations for Sprint and Hill Climb.

3.3 For the purposes of championship marking cars will be divided into the following classes:
S.12.4.1 Modified cars must comply with MSUK regulations section Ch.14 App.4 Art 26.1
All classes - For handicap scoring purposes the Manufacturer, type, size and tread pattern of tyre must remain as nominated on the championship entry form (ie: the same) throughout the season , if any changes are made then the series Handicapper & Organisers must be informed as a revised handicap may be issued

4. CLASS STRUCTURE

4.1 Entries will be made into a single class with awards at the end of the year for the following:

- Fastest 4-Wheel Drive Car with a valid Motorsport UK Rally Log Book
- Fastest 4-Wheel Drive Car without a Motorsport UK Rally Log Book
- Fastest Front Wheel Drive Car
- Fastest Rear Wheel Drive Car
- Fastest Rally Category 1 Car with a valid Motorsport UK Rally Log Book
- Fastest Rally Category 2 Car with a valid Motorsport UK Rally Log Book
- Fastest Rally Category 3 Car with a valid Motorsport UK Rally Log Book
- Fastest Rally Category 4a Car with a valid Motorsport UK Rally Log Book
- Fastest Rally Category 4b Car with a valid Motorsport UK Rally Log Book

5. ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS

Motorsport UK are exceedingly concerned of the impact of single-use plastic tyre wrapping and with reusable alternatives available competitors are encouraged to reduce plastic usage in this regard. The use of these plastic wraps is prohibited as per Ch.14 App.2 Art.1.3
